Belvoir Fruit Farm

Belvoir Farm in the Vale of Belvoir, Leicestershire, kindly hosted the MCAVA visit on the 23rd September. The company produces the well-known and enjoyed fruit drinks, a business

which started approximately 40 years ago at the farmhouse kitchen of the owner, Pev Manners. Pev's mother and father started producing an 🕻 elderflower cordial from flowers picked from their farm hedgerows, to gift to local friends and farmers. The business has grown from there to a very successful British business supplying stockists worldwide.



It was extremely interesting to hear the history of the business from Pev. Both Pev and his colleagues provided a very fascinating tour of the factory, explaining the process of making and bottling the various flavours of drinks, the ups (the public coming from all over to donate elderflower's they had picked from their hedgerows) and the downs (on the day of our visit the UK CO2 shortage was a huge concern) of such a business, as well as an insight into the food and drinks supply chain.

The afternoon was an interesting insight into a farm diversification. Thanks must go to not only Pev Manners and his team for hosting us but to Nicola Clayton-Bailey for organising the afternoon and supper at The Chequers Inn, Woolsthorpe afterwards.

On 16 September William Craven hosted a tour of the Milton Estate by kind permission of Sir Philip Naylor Leyland. A group of 20 were shown through the Repton parkland to the hunt kennels. We listened to a fascinating talk from the falconer and kennel master on the family pack, which dates back to about 1740.

We then visited the estate village of Marholm and discussed the challenges presented in finding new revenue generating uses for thatched traditional buildings set within the core of the estate following the surrender of a traditional farm yard.

Finally we were then treated to an excellent afternoon tea followed by a tour of the gardens and the restored Orangery.
